# Important safety conditions

If you want to use this product correctly, carefully read this user's manual and store it for future reference. If you give (sell) the device to somebody, please also include all the documentation together with this device, including this user's manual.



The flash symbol in an equilateral triangle indicates that there is dangerous voltage inside this device, which presents a risk of injury by electrical To reduce the risk of injury by electrical shock do not remove the cover (or the rear side). There are no components inside which the user can repair. Have all repairs or adjustments performed at an authorised service centre.



The exclamation mark in an equilateral triangle symbol indicates important operating or servicing instructions in the device's documentation.

### General safety instructions

- Carefully read this manual before using the device. Follow the instructions contained in this user's manual.
- Heed all warnings.
- Adhere to all instructions.
- Use only accessories determined by the manufacturer.
- AN OPEN FLAME MUST NOT BE PLACED ON THE DEVICE, E.G. A BURNING CANDLE. DO NOT PLACE HOT ITEMS OR OBJECTS WITH AN OPEN FLAME E.G. CANDLES OR NIGHT LAMPS ON OR IN THE VICINITY OF THE DEVICE. HIGH TEMPERATURES MAY MELT PLASTIC PARTS AND CAUSE A FIRE.
- Use the device in a temperate climate zone.
- Neither the manufacturer nor the vendor of the device under any condition takes responsibility for any direct or indirect damages caused by not adhering to instructions for installation, set-up, use, servicing or cleaning of this device as described in this user's manual.
- Protect the device against being knocked, dropped, hit, shaken and against vibrations, humidity and dust.
- Before allowing children to use the device, they must be appropriately to their age, informed about the correct and safe use of the player.
- If the device is equipped with a headphone jack, do not use headphones set to an extreme volume. There is a danger of hearing damage or loss.

servicing use only identical spare parts.

### Installation, operation

- Install the device according to the instructions in the user's manual.
- Leave free space on all sides of the device, necessary for proper air circulation.
   This removes the heat created during operation. Covering the ventilation openings of the device's case creates a risk of overheating or damaging the device. It is necessary to ensure that the ventilation openings are not blocked, e.g. by a newspaper, table cloth, curtain, etc. Follow the installation instructions in the user's manual.
- This device should not be located in a closed-off area such as a bookshelf or rack, if sufficient ventilation is not provided for or the instructions of the manufacturer are not followed.
- Never insert any items into any ventilation or other openings because they could come
  into contact with points with dangerous voltage levels or cause a short circuit of parts,
  which could cause a fire or injury by electric shock. Never pour any liquid into the device.
- Do not install the device in direct sunlight or near sources of heat, such as heaters, heat exchangers, stoves or other appliances (including amplifiers) producing heat. High temperatures significantly reduce the lifetime of electronic components in the device. Do not use or leave the device in the vicinity of an open fire.
- The device must not be exposed to dripping or running water and objects filled with
  water must not be placed on it, e.g. vases. Protect the device against rain, spray or
  contact with any other liquid, do not leave or install the device outdoors. Do not use
  the device outdoors. Not adhering to these instructions creates a risk of electrical
  shock or fire hazard
- Do not use this device near water
- Treat the glass panels and the device cover with care. The screen glass can break on impact and cause serious injuries.
- Make sure that the power cord is not stepped on or compressed, particularly near the
  power plug, power socket and at the point where it exits the device or the adapter.
   The power plug (adapter) is used as a disconnection device and must be easily accessible.
- Never use a device with a damaged power cord or plug. If the power cord or plug
  are damaged, turn off the device, disconnect it from the power source and contact
  an authorised service centre. A damaged power cord or plug may only be replaced
  by qualified personnel. Under no circumstances attempt to replace the power cord or
  plug yourself.
- Do not try to circumvent the polarised power plug safety feature. If the power plug cannot be inserted into your power socket, contact a qualified electrician to replace the old tupe of power socket.
- Before connecting the device into a power socket, check that the voltage in your
  power socket corresponds to the voltage on the rating label of the device or on its
  power adapter. If you are not certain about the type of the power sources in your
  home, contact your vendor or the local energy company.
- Before turning on the device, check that the electrical connection is performed properly
  and in accordance with the instructions of the manufacturer. Before connecting or
  changing the connection, turn off the device and disconnect it from the mains.
- Remember to always disconnect the power plug (adapter) from the power socket before disconnecting the power cable from the rear side of the device.

- Insert the power plug into a separate power socket. Do not overload wall sockets with extension cords or multi-socket adapters. There is a risk of injury by electric shock.
- When disconnecting, hold the power cord by the plug and not by the cord itself.
- Disconnect the device from the power socket during storms or if you will not be using it for an extended period of time.
- Avoid moving the device from a cold environment to a warm one or vice versa, or
  when using the device in a very humid environment. Air humidity may condense on
  some components inside the case of the device and the device may stop working
  temporarily. If this occurs leave the device in a warm and well ventilated place and
  wait 1 2 hours until the moisture evaporates and the device can once more be used
  as usual. Take care especially during the first use of the player immediately after its
  purchase during a cold season.
- Do not place this device on an unstable cart, pedestal, stand, bracket or table.
   The device could fall and cause serious injuries to children or adults or could be seriously damaged or damage other items. Only use the device with a cart, pedestal, stand or table designated by the manufacturer or sold with the device. Any mounting of the device should be carried out according to the manufacturer's instructions and the mounting accessories recommended by the manufacturer should be used.
- Do not lean on the device, do not lean over it or use it as a step. Protect it against
  violent movements. Ensure that children do not plau with the device.
- If using the cart, be careful when moving it. Stopping suddenly, excessive force and
  - uneven surfaces could cause the cart to fall over with the device

Only connect the device to a properly grounded socket with a protective grounding pin.

If you will be installing the device on a wall or to the ceiling, follow the manufacturer's instruction found in the user's manual of the particular device.

# Repairs and maintenance

- To prevent risk of injury through electric shock or the creation of a fire, do not take
  the device out of the case there are no parts inside the case repairable or adjustable
  by the user without relevant equipment and qualifications. Should the device require
  adjustment or repair, contact a professional service centre.
- In the case of any unusual events occurring during the use of the device, e.g. if
  there is a distinct smell of burning insulation or smoke comes out of the device,
  immediately turn off the device, disconnect the device from the power source and do
  not use the device until you have received the results of the inspection performed by
  the employees of the professional service centre.
- Have all repairs carried out by qualified personnel. Repairs are necessary if the device
  has been damaged in any way, for example if the power cord is damaged, liquid was
  poured on the device, foreign objects have entered the device, the device has been
  exposed to rain or moisture, if the device is not working as usual or if it has fallen.
- In the event of repair or replacement of a part of the device, ensure that the
  service technician uses components designated by the manufacturer or that these
  components have the same specifications as the original ones. Unauthorised
  replacements could cause a fire, lead to a danger of injury by electrical shock or other
  dangers.
- Before cleaning, carrying or other maintenance, disconnect the plug (adapter) from the power socket.
- Clean the device only with a dry cloth.
- For cleaning do not use petrol, thinners or any other solvents or use any abrasive cleaning agents, steel wool or any sponges with steel wool.

### Remote control and batteries

- Do not expose the remote control or the batteries to direct sunlight or sources of heat, such as heaters, heat exchangers, stoves or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat. Do not use or leave the device in the vicinity of an open fire.
- Ensure that the sensor is not exposed to a strong light source (e.g. sunlight) or light from fluorescent light tubes, which could reduce the effectiveness and reliability of the remote control.
- Neither the remote control nor the batteries may be exposed to dripping or running
  water and objects filled with water must not be placed on them, e.g. vases. Protect
  against exposure to rain, spraying or pouring of any kind of liquid. Do not use
  outdoors. Not following these instructions creates a danger of damage to the remote
  control or to the battery.
- Do not use this device near water.

- It is necessary to pay attention to the environmental impact aspects of battery disposal.
- The incorrect use of batteries may cause the leakage of the electrolute and corrosion. To ensure that the remote control works correctly, proceed according to the instructions below:
- Do not insert the batteries in the wrong direction.
- Do not recharge, heat, open or short circuit the batteries.
- Do not throw batteries into a fire
- Do not leave discharged batteries in the remote control.
- Do not combine various tupes of batteries or new and old batteries.
- If you will not be using the remote control for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent potential damage caused by a subsequent battery leakage.
- If the remote control is not working correctly or its operating range is reduced, change all batteries for new ones.
- If electrolute leaks out from the batteries, have the remote control cleaned at an authorised service centre.



# Supplement to the LCD TV user's manual

Measures to take when a static image is displayed; red/blue/green pixels on the screen.

### A static image can permanently damage the display part of the television

- Do not leave a static image on an LCD screen for longer than 2 hours, because this could damage the screen. This type of damage is known as "screen burn-in".
- Similar damage to the LCD screen can be caused by a statically located TV channel logo.



The display of a static image from video games or computers for an extended period
of time may cause a partial effect of a "persistent image". To prevent this effect from
occurring, lower the brightness and contrast when displaying a static picture.
Damage to the screen resulting from the above mentioned causes is not covered by
the warrantu!

### Red/blue/green/black pixels may appear on the screen

This is a characteristic feature of liquid crystal displays and does not represent
a problem. LCD screens are manufactured using a very precise technology in order to
achieve a very fine picture resolution. From time to time several inactive pixels may
appear on the screen as a permanently red, blue, green or black pixel (up to 0.001%
of the total number of pixels on the screen). This does not in any way affect the
features and performance of uour television.

### Notes on the USB connector:

USB memory devices must be inserted into the device directly. To prevent data transmission failure or its interference, do not use USB extension cables. Electrostatic discharges may cause the device to malfunction. In such an event the user must restart the device

Before using a USB memory device, test its ability to communicate with the device and its data reading and writing speed.

To achieve maximum reading speed we recommend that you keep disk space defragmented. Use the FAT32 file system, a single partition, without protection. If reading and writing on the USB memory device is not continuous, undesirable effects may occur such as partial image loss (distortions/checkering effects) or complete image loss, audio defects, and in extreme cases the operation will be stopped. Unexpected behaviour of the connected memory device, or the presence of viruses or other damaging software may cause the functions of the device to stop working, necessitating a restart.

The USB connector is the standard type and is not able to power a USB device with a high power usage (e.g. hard disk drives HDD). Use devices with independent power supplies and power them from their own power supplies.

The device was designed to achieve maximum compatibility with memory devices. With respect to the variety of devices on the market it is not possible to guarantee compatibility with every USB device. In the event of difficulties try formatting the memory device directly in the device. If problems persist, use a different memory device.

Due to the wide range of SD/MMC/MS cards/USB devices available on the market it is not possible to guarantee the compatibility of the device with all SD/MMC/MS cards/USB devices.









# 2. Remote control



### 1. (I) button

Turns the television on from the stand-by mode.

### 2. Numerical huttons 0-9

Press 0-9 to directly select a TV channel in ATV and DTV mode

In the DTV mode\* it serves to select numerical items in a menu.

### 3. DISPLAY button

Press to display information about the current channel such as the current time and the name of the channel (ATV/DTV).

Press to show information about the disc (DVD mode\*).

### 4. EPG button

Press to show EPG (Electronic Program Guide) (DTV mode)

### 5. **◄/▲/▼/**▶ buttons

Used for navigating in a menu on the screen and for setting up the television according to your preferences.

### 6. SETUP button

Press to show the OSD menu.

### 7. CH.LIST button

Press to show a list of channels (ATV/DTV mode)

#### 8. S.MODE button

Press to show the audio mode

### 9. CH +/- buttons

Press to switch between individual channels.

#### PAGE +/- huttons

Serves to skip to the next/previous page in teletext (ATV mode).

Serves to zoom in/out of a displayed picture (USB mode).

### 10. RECORD LIST button

Serves to open the list of recordings.

### 11. RECORD button


Serves to start recording on to a USB device (DTV mode)

### 12. INDEX button

Call up a teletext content page (ATV mode).

#### ■ (Stop)

Serves to stop playback or recording (USB/DVD modes\*).



### 13. TEXT button

Turns teletext on or off (ATV/DTV mode).

#### **I** ▶ /II

Starts/pauses playback (USB/DVD modes)
Time shift function (Time shift)(DTV modes).

### 14. Coloured buttons

Serves to perform various functions in teletext or adjusting channels in ATV/DTV mode.

### GOTO button (RED)

Skip to a determined time location while playing a DVD/CD (DVD mode\*)

### A-B button (GREEN)

Repeat playback of a selected segment designated bu points A and B (DVD mode\*).

### **REPEAT button (YELLOW)**

Select between various type of repeated playback (DVD mode\*).

### ANGLE button (BLUE)

Select various display angles of a video (DVD mode\*).

### 15. HOLD button

Holding the current display in teletext (ATV mode).

#### TITLE

Serves to display the contents of a DVD title (DVD mode\*).

### 16. S.PAGE button

Serves to display a subpage in teletext (ATV mode).

#### **DVD-MENU**

Serves to display the DVD menu (DVD mode\*).

### 17. SLEEP button

Serves to set the TV sleep timer.

### 18. EJECT button

Serves to eject the DVD disc (DVD mode\*).

### 19. MUTE button

Serves to immediately silence the system and to renew the TV volume.

### 20. RECALL button

Serves to switch to the previous last watched channel (ATV/DTV mode).

### 21. SOURCE button

Serves to select an input signal source.

#### 22. FAV button

Serves to display a list of favourite channels (ATV/DTV mode).

#### 23. OK hulton

Serves to confirm a selection

#### 24. FXIT/CANCEL hullon

Serves to exit from a menu or to cancel a performed action.

### 25. VOL+/- buttons

Serve to set the volume

#### 26 PMODE bullon

Serves to select a nicture mode.

### 27. S.TITLE button

Serves to select subtitles, which are broadcast together with the program (DTV mode).

#### **SUBTITLE**

Serves to select subtitles in DVB mode (\*).

#### 28. AUDIO hutton

Serves to switch between audio languages (available only if the TV program/disc support this function) (DTV/DVD modes).

### 29. REVEAL button

Serves to reveal hidden information such as answers to a guiz in teletext (ATV mode).

### 

Serves to fast forward (DVD/Media modes\*).

Hold it down for approx. 3 seconds to skip to the next chapter/track/image (DVD/Media modes\*).

### 30. MIX button

Serves to combine teletext with a TV program (ATV mode).

#### **44**/**144**

Serves to fast rewind (DVD/Media modes\*).

Hold it down for approx. 3 seconds to skip to the previous chapter/track/image (DVD/Media modes\*).

### 31. SIZE button

Serves to increase the TV picture in teletext (ATV mode).

### ZOOM+

Serves to zoom in on a displayed picture (DVD mode\*).

### 32. ZOOM- button

Serves to zoom out of a displayed picture (DVD mode\*).

#### 33. TV/RADIO button

Serves to switch between TV and RADIO modes (DTV mode)

### 34. SCALER button

Serves to watch the picture in various formats.

#### Note:


Remove the batteries if you will be storing the device or not using it for an extended period of time.

- To control the device using the remote control, point the remote control at the device and then press the button with the required function. The effective range of the remote control is up to about 5 meters with a maximum deviation of +/- 30° from the perpendicular direction to the reception sensor of the remote control on the front side of the device. The falling capacity of the batteries gradually reduces the remote control range. There must be no solid obstacles in the area between the remote control and the device when the remote control is being used.
- During standard use the lifetime of batteries in the remote control is about 1 year.
   When the effective range of the remote control is substantially reduced or when
   there are problems with its use, change both the batteries in the remote control. If
   you will not be using the remote control for a longer period of time, take out both
   batteries in this way you will prevent potential damage caused by their leakage.
- Prevent strong light from falling on the device, (e.g. sunlight or strong fluorescent lamps or ecological light bulbs), which could reduce the effectiveness and reliability of the infrared remote control.

### **Battery Installation**


Remove the battery compartment cover. Insert two type CR2025 (3 V) batteries as shown on the picture below. Ensure that the batteries have the correct polarity when inserting them. Return the cover back to its place.





# 3. Before using

### 3.1. Installation of a TV stand






### **ATTENTION**

When installing the TV stand, place the TV screen on a soft surface so as to prevent damaging the surface of the device.

You should connect all the necessary cables BEFORE connecting the power cord.

### 4. Basic controls

### 4.1. Turning on

As soon as the device is placed/attached in a suitable location, on a table or on a wall, and all the necessary cables have been connected, including the power cord, do the following. Press the  $\circlearrowleft$  button on the remote control to turn on the power to the television, its LED indicator will be lit green. Now you can use the many functions of your new television.

### 4.2. Selecting an input source

Press the **SOURCE** button to show the input source list. Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the desired input source. Press the **OK** button or ▶ to confirm the input source.

### Note:

The grey items shown on pictures here may not be activate for a given model or are explained in a different part of this user's manual.

Press the **SETUP** button to show the main OSD menu.

Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the desired menu.

Press the  $\mathbf{0K}$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  button to enter the submenu. Use the  $\blacktriangleleft$  button to return back to the previous menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select an option and then press the **OK** button or  $\triangleright$  to enter the submenu, use the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons to set a value or the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select a submenu. Press the **SETUP** button to save and return back to the previous menu and press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.

Press the **DISPLAY** button on the remote control to display information about the broadcast channel



- 1 Current source
- 2. Current channel number.
- 3. NICAM mode of the current channel.
- 4. The audio system of the current channel can be changed in the manual analogue search menu.

### 4.3. Picture Menu

Press **SETUP** to display the main menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Picture** and enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button.



- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item which you wish to adjust and enter the menu by pressing the **OK** or ▶ button.
- Use the ◄/▶ buttons to set the value, or use the ▲/▼ buttons to select another submenu. And enter the menu using the OK or ▶ button.
- 3. After completing setup, press the **SETUP** button to save and return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.



### 4.1.3. Picture Mode

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the item **Picture Mode** and enter the menu using the **OK** or button and select a mode using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. (In the menu there are the following modes: User, Standard, Vivid, Soft, Optimal.

The items Brightness/Contrast/Sharpness/Color can only be changed in the User mode.

### Note:

Repeatedly press the **P.MODE** button on the remote control to directly change the picture mode.

### Picture: Standard

### 4.2.3. Brightness

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Brightness**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and perform the settings using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.3.3. Contrast

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Contrast**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and perform the settings using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.



### 4.3.4. Sharpness

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Sharpness**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and perform the settings using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.3.5. Colour

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Colour**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and perform the settings using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.3.6. Tint

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Tint**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and perform the settings using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.3.7. Colour Temperature

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Colour Temperature**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and then using the  $\triangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons, select between Standard, Cool or Warm.

### 4.3.8. Noise Reduction

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Noise Reduction**, then enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button and then using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons, select between Off, Low, Middle or High.

#### 439 Reset

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Reset**, then enter the menu using the **OK** button or use the  $\triangleright$  button to confirm and then select **OK** to reset the values

### 4.4. Sound Menu

Press **SETUP** to display the main menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Sound** and enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button.



- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item which you wish to adjust and enter the menu bu pressing the **OK** or ▶ button.
- Use the ◄/➤ buttons to set the value, or use the ▲/▼ buttons to select another submenu. And enter the menu using the OK or ▲ button.
- 3. After completing setup, press the **SETUP** button to save and return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.

#### 4.4.1 Sound Mode

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Sound Mode** and enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button. Then use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select a sound mode. (The following option are available: User, Standard, Movie, Music, Speech).

The items Bass, Treble, Balance and Equaliser can only be changed in the User mode.



#### Note:

Repeatedly press the **S.MODE** button on the remote control to directly change the sound mode.

#### 4.4.2 Bass

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Bass**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and set the value using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

#### 4.4.3. Balance

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Balance**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and set the value using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.4.4. Treble

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Treble**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and set the value using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.4.5. EQ

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **EQ**, then use the **OK** or **>** button to enter the submenu and using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons select from the equaliser modes: EQ100HZ, EQ300HZ, EQ1KHZ, EQ3KHZ, EQ8KHZ). Then use the **OK** or **>** button to enter the submenu and select the value using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons. Then press the **SETUP** button to directly return to the previous menu.

### 4.4.6. Surround (Surround sound)

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Surround**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and using the  $\triangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons select On or Off.

### 4.4.7. AVL (Automatic volume limiter)

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **AVL (Automatic volume limiter)**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and using the  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons select On or Off.

### 4.4.8. Reset

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the option **Reset**, then enter the menu using the **OK** button or use the  $\triangleright$  button to confirm and then select **OK** to reset the values.

### 4.5. Channel Menu

Press **SETUP** to display the main menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Channel** and enter the menu using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button.



- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item which you wish to adjust and enter the menu by pressing the **OK** or ▶ button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select an item and enter the submenu using the OK or ► button
- 3. After completing setup, press the **SETUP** button to save and return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.

### 4.1.5. Channel Management

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the item **Channel Management** and then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu.







Press the **BLUE** button to move a channel.

If any of the channels was incorrectly located in the list, you can move it to the existing position using the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons. Select a channel that you wish to move. Press the **BLUE** button and move it to a new position and pres the **OK** or **Blue** button. This will confirm the move to the new position. If the delete channel logo appears, press the **SETUP** or **OK** button and the following menu will appear:

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select a channel, then press the **OK** button to enter the rename channel menu.



Press the **RED** button to insert a space.

Press the **GREEN** button to change the mode.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  or  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  buttons to select a character and confirm using the **OK** button.

Press the **YELLOW** button to delete a character.

Press the **BLUE** button to save the changes and to return to the previous page.

Press the **EXIT** button and the following screen will appear:



To completely exit the menu, select "Cancel", but the changes will not be saved. To successfully save, select "OK" and the following screen will appear informing you about the successful save



### 4.5.2. Favorite Manager

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the item **Favorite Manager** and then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu.



Use the A/V buttons to select Channel and use the **RED** button to select Fav1.

Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select Channel and use the **GREEN** button to select Fav2.

Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select Channel and use the **YELLOW** button to select Fav3.

Use the **△/▼** buttons to select Channel and use the **BLUE** button to select Fav4.

If the selected channel is already included in the favourites list, press the RED, GREEN,

YELLOW or BLUE button again to cancel its favourite status.

Press the **MENU** or **EXIT** button and the modified menu will be shown

### 4.5.3. Country

Use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu, then use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the appropriate country of installation and confirm using the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button.

### 4.5.4. Auto Search

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the item **Auto Search** and then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu. (If the lock has been set, you will be asked to enter a password "0000".)

Into the field "Old Password" enter the old password. If the password is incorrect, you will not be able to change the password.

Into the field "Confirm New Password" enter the new password again. If both the new passwords are entered correctly, a screen will appear with a message about the new password being successfully saved, otherwise the system will display a message that the passwords were entered incorrectly.

- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select an item, or use the ▲/▼ buttons to select another item

Use the cursor to enter the password "0000".

The following screen will appear.



Select "Cancel" to return to the previous menu and press **OK**.

Select "OK" and press the **OK** button, shortly the reset menu will appear.

The screen with the initial settings will appear:

Press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu and ignore the subsequent settings.

### Setup 1

## 5.1. Channel Menu

Press the **SETUP** button to display the main menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Channel** in the main menu, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the menu.



- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item which you wish to adjust and enter the menu by pressing the **OK** or ▶ button.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select an item, or use the ▲/▼ buttons to select another item.
- 3. After completing setup, press the **SETUP** button to save and return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.

- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select an item, or use the ▲/▼ buttons to select another item
- 3. After completing setup, press the **SETUP** button to save and return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to completely exit the menu.

## 5.2.1. PVR (Personal video recorder)





## Program

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Channel**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  button to enter the submenu and use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select the channel that you wish to add to the timer list.

#### Start Time

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Start Time**, then use the **OK** or  $\triangleright$  buttons to enter the submenu and use the numerical buttons to enter the start time.

## Duration

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select **Duration**, then use the **OK** button to enter the submenuand use the numerical buttons to enter the duration

## Date





## 5.6. EPG (Electronic Program Guide)

Press the **EPG** button on the remote control to display the daily mode of the EPG menu.



- 1. Number and name of the channel being watched
- 2. Start and end of the program currently being watched and the name of the broadcast program
- 3. Current date and time

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  buttons to select a channel or program.

You can use the **◄/▶** buttons to switch between channels and programs.

You can use the **RED** button to switch between the weekly EPG mode and the daily EPG mode.

If you want to find out about programs that were broadcast in the past, press the **YELLOW** button

If you want to find out about programs that will broadcast in the future, press the **BLUE** button

For more information about the broadcast program, press the **INFO** button.

Press the **GREEN** button once to add a channel to the channel list **.** 

Press the **GREEN** button twice to add a channel to the reminder list. A small reminder long will be appear next to the program .

Press the **EPG** button again or the **EXIT** button to cancel the operation.

The channel will be marked as coded \$\square\$.

## 5.7. Multi-Audio

Press the **AUDIO** button on the remote control to display the multi-audio menu.



Use the **◄/>** buttons to select the audio language format

Press the button on the remote control in the DTV mode.

If the speed of the device is insufficient, the following screen will appear:



It is necessary to change the speed of the device, or select **OK** to continue.

Press the button on the remote control to start recording, the following screen will appear:



Select "Yes" (Yes) to start recording. The following screen will appear:

When recording, the following icon will be displayed:

Press the button on the remote control again to set the recording time.



Press the button on the remote control again to stop recording.



After finishing recording, select "Yes", to continue recording select "No".

## 6. Teletext

The majority of TV stations provide free teletext information, including the latest news, weather information, TV programmes and stock market information, etc. You can only insert the teletext page based on the teletext content.

## Displaying teletext

Select a channel with a teletext signal.

Press the **TEXT** button.

Select the appropriate page using the coloured buttons on the remote control.

Press **TEXT** again and the TV screen will appear.

## Selecting a page

You can enter a 3-digit number to go to desired page using the numerical buttons. If the entered number is invalid, you must enter the correct 3-digit number again as soon as you finish entering the numbers.

You can scroll pages forwards or backwards using the **PAGE+/-** buttons.

#### Mixed mode

This function makes it possible to watch TV and teletext at the same time. When a certain teletext page is displayed, press the **TEXT** button again and the screen will display information about the TV and teletext at the same time Press the **TEXT** button again and only the TV screen will be shown.

#### Lock

You can press the **HOLD** button to lock the teletext page. To cancel the page lock, press this button again.

#### Index

Press the **INDEX** page to display contents pages.

Enter a specific teletext page using the numerical buttons.

## Zooming in teletext

If a teletext page is displayed, you can zoom in to double the size of this page.

Press the **SIZE** button to zoom into the top half of the teletext page.

Press the **SIZE** button again to zoom move to the bottom part of the teletext page.

Press this button once more to return to the original display.

## Display mode

Press the **REVEAL** button to show hidden teletext information. Press this button again to cancel.

#### Coloured buttons (red. green, uellow and blue)

## 10. USB devices

#### **Brief introduction**

This device has a USB 2.0 interface and can therefore playback music, movies or images from USB devices

USB is an abbreviation of Universal Serial Bus. The majority of USB devices available on the market are either USB 1.1 or USB 2.0. Here we list several types of USB 1.1 devices: Monitor communication devices, sound devices, Human Input Devices (HID), high capacity memories, the majority of flash disks, USB HDD, etc. are high capacity memory devices. High capacity memory devices enable 2 types of transmission formats:

- 1. USB 1.1 Mass Storage Class Control/Bulk/Interrupt (CBI)
- USB 1.1 Mass Storage Class Bulk-Only Transport. This device only supports USB 1.1
  Mass Storage Class Bulk-Only Transport, we are not certain whether different USB
  devices will be supported! For this reason, please first find out the characteristics of
  the USB device before using it.

## Note:

- 1. This device supports the MP3. MPEG1. MPEG2. AVI. JPEG and BMP formats.
- 2. This device supports the FAT16, FAT32 and NTFS formats.
- 3. MTP (Media Transfer Protocol) is not supported.
- 4. Connect the device directly into the USB port on your television. If you are using an extension cable, compatibility problems may arise.
- Before connecting a device to the television, back up your files to prevent damage or loss of data. The manufacturer takes no responsibility for data loss or damage.
- 6. Do not disconnect the USB device while it is loading.
- 7. If you wish to change the playback mode, you first need to exit from the current playback mode by pressing the **EXIT** button.
- 8. The higher the resolution of the picture the longer it will take to display on the screen.
- In the case of unsupported or damaged files the message "Unsupported format" will appear.





## 11. Care and maintenance

Premature malfunction can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the lifetime of your new television. Before starting to clean, do not forget to turn off the television and to pull the power cord out of the power socket.

## Cleaning the screen

- Remove dust from the screen in the following manner. Dampen a fine wiping cloth
  in lukewarm water containing an washing detergent for textiles or a dishwashing
  detergent. Wring the wiping cloth until it is almost dru and use it to clean the screen.
- 2. Make sure that the screen is not wet and allow it to dry naturally before turning it on.

## Cleaning other parts

To clean dirt or dust, wipe the other parts of the television with a fine dry lint-free wiping cloth. Do not use a damp wiping cloth.

## Taking out of operation for an extended period



If you will not be using the television for an extended period of time (e.g. during a holiday), it is advisable to pull the power cord out of the power socket to prevent the television from being damaged as a result of a lightning strike or current spike.
